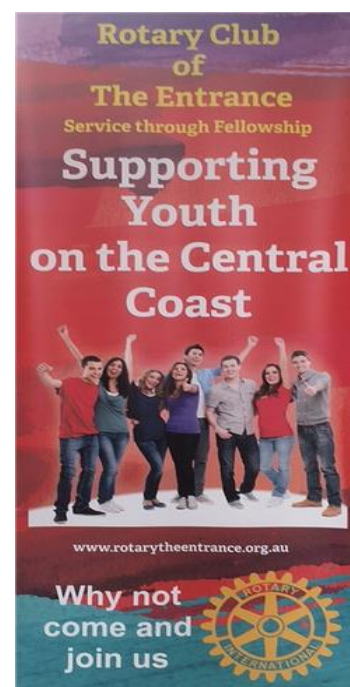

Report covering on the activities of the last 2-3 weeks since Issue 9

Dinner meeting held on November 19

15 members & guests including 3 family members of David Adermann & Stephanie & Kirsty from the Challenge organisation heard Lindsay May give one of the best talks we have heard for sometime. Lindsay told us about the trip he took in 2017 with two of his adult sons “**walking the Kokoda Track.**” Lindsay showed us some excellent photos of the trip which gave us an excellent idea of the difficulties that anyone undertaking it would face especially in the rainy season. The terrain is very hilly so trekkers are constantly having to walk up and down often quite steep hills. The trek is hardly defined & has no firm surface – it is just a zigzagging muddy path often crossed by the roots of trees & walkers can easily sink over their boots in the mud.

Just to walk it with a light pack would be difficult. The party had porters for the heavy & bulky items but Lindsay’s sons carried rucksacks. What it would have been like for our soldiers in WW2 often carrying all their kit & food plus weapons & ammunition (up to 70lbs / 35 kilos). That many of them were often undernourished & badly weakened from the effects of dysentery would have made it a real test of will.

Lindsay & his boys raised \$28,000 for the Salvos by their efforts!

Cops & Kids Oz tag tournament at PCYC. This had been rescheduled to Friday 22nd . It involved some 12 teams of seven, two from the cops & the other ten from local schools & the PCYC . Renee Dunn from the Samaritans at Bateau Bay had agreed to provide a lunchtime BarBQ & iced water & we donated \$200 to help defray the cost. I helped Renee & a couple of volunteers from a tree lopping business to do the Bar BQ. All the participants seemed to enjoy the day which included 5 pool matches & then a further three games if your team got to the finals. The cops started well but ran out of steam & the final was contested by two of the “ kids ” teams. A well run & very worthwhile activity which gives the local cops a human face & gives everyone a chance to intermix in a friendly sporting contest.

Fundraising.

We ran Spin & Win at Bateau Bay Square Shopping centre on Saturday 16th November. Robin co-ordinated it & we raised some \$200 plus donations.

David , Clive, Robin, Gordon & Sue ran a Bunnings Bar BQ on wed 20th November. We were assisted by Renee Dunn from the Samaritan who helped us over the busy lunchtime period. Renee also brought along Emily as an extra volunteer. Emily fitted in well with the team and is welcome to come back and help at any future Bar BQs if she has the time.

We sold some 13 and a half trays of snags & achieve sales of just over \$900 plus almost \$100 in donations to the bushfires & drought relief. Well done everyone & an especial thanks to Renee & Emily

Charity golf day in aid of The North Gosford Learning Centre (4 man Ambrose at The springs, Peats ridge)

Bruce Davies of CCCI asked us for our support. The board agreed I could spend up to \$200 & using Robins contacts from the Community raffle I was able to obtain a raffle prize of a package from the Crowne Plaza , Terrigal which includes a suite for one night for a couple with a buffet breakfast & free parking for that \$200 (notional value \$396)

Board Meeting held on December 3

It was decided at the Board meeting that we would donate \$500 each to the Rotary Taree Bushfire Appeal & to Drought Relief if possible before Christmas. Robin has subsequently expedited the payment to the bushfire appeal but we are yet to source an appropriate & effective means of adding our donation to other Rotary donations to a farming community.

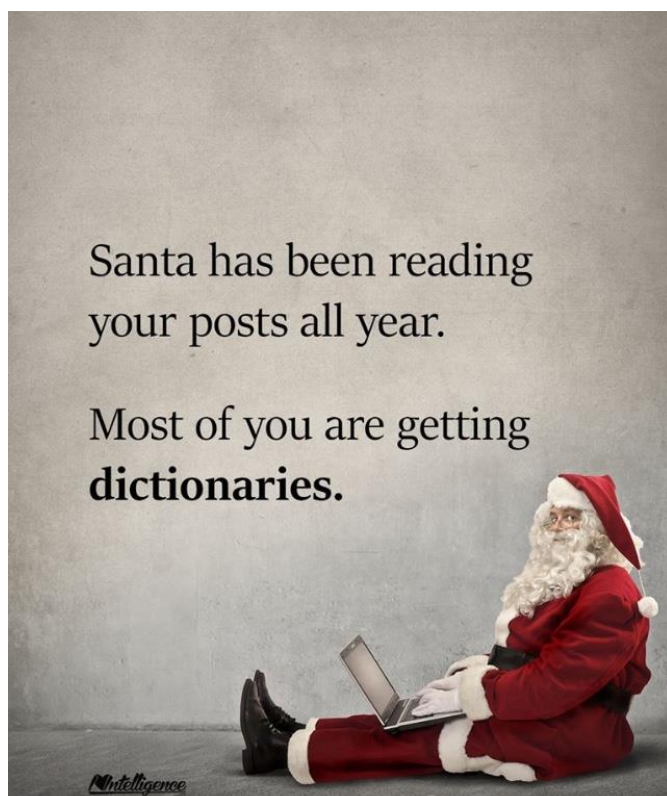
