

Reports for Club Meeting held on Tuesday 6 August

Night report – Tuesday 6th August

Present : President Clive, Robin, Gordon, David W, Peter & John plus Shirl, Sue ADG Jason & guest speaker David Little. We were joined later By Anthony & Kathleen Trott.

Pres Clive welcomed ADG (assistant district governor) Jason & guest speaker david.

Jason introduced himself. He is a rotaractor & rotarian of 25 years standing has been Pres of his club(s) twice and is currently Secretay of Erina. He works in ar area of public sexual health.

Directors Reports:

Membership : Gordon reported that Hannah Clendenning (from eng & science forum) & David Stewart ex Kincumber Rotary had both expressed an interest in receiving the Pelican News but at this stage would just like to be considered "Friends of Rotary". Clive was encouraged to invite them to meetings when we had a guest speaker on a topic that might interest them.

He reported that he had received a positive response from Paul Barnett, the CEO of Mingara, to our request to address our proposed breakfast forum. Paul offered 2nd and 30th Sept & it was agreed that gordon's suggestion that he meet with Paul on the former and suggest 30th Sept for the forum itself was our preferred option as it gives us more time to prepare for the event. Gordon to book the venue for the 30th sept.

Anthony & Kathleen handed over their application to become family Members

Treasurer & Secretary – nothing to report

Community Service: Robin reported that he had firmed up the prizes for the Community Raffle & sent a draf tof the tickets to the Printer. David indicated that he had the data base in good shape & was prepared for us to move on to the next stage. It was agreed that the letters to be emailed needed reviewing especially as we do not have access to Sleemans this year for collection & drop off of tickets. It was agreed that we should try to get community organisations to come to our meeting on sept 25th to collect their tickets whenever possible. Failing that Robin had offered to nominate some dates when they could collect tickets from his house. After that, they would have to phone up and make specific arrangements for collection.

Youth – Gordon reported that he had passed the last report from Becky Trott (exchange student) to Clive to put in the next Bulletin. David asked all members to think of possible candidates for RYLA (applications close at end of October.

President's – Clive thanked those members who had helped the SAW on Sat 3rd & at our 1st Bunnings Bar-B-Q of the year on wed 31st July. We achieved targeted sales of \$1000 & profit of around \$700

After Dinner PDG Peter introduced our **speaker- David Little from the RFS.**

David gave an interesting talk lasting some 25 minutes. He is the new station commander at Berkeley vale, has been in the RFS for some 10 years & has undertaken sufficient competency courses to be given an award as a good allround firefighter. Those competency courses included first aid, use of breathing apparatus, communications & resuscitation. Whilst the RFS has its core competency fighting bushfires it was interesting to hear that they are involved either on their own or in assisting other organisations such as Fire & Rescue, SES or NSW ambulance in a wide range of incidents including fires in metro areas, car accidents, storm & flood damage etc. He also explained that the Central Coast council had recently issued new guidelines for burning. People on properties had a wider discretion to burn off small quantities of scrub & wooden litter in winter months & could also do so between October & April as long as they received a permit & did it in appropriate weather conditions. David said he thought that it was a very positive step in preventing the build up of too much potential fuel for bush fires. It was also interesting to learn that there are about seven volunteers or part-time firefighters for every fulltime paid fire fighter. David finished by saying that they were having an Open day on 14th September at the Berkeley Vale RFS station & we would all be welcome to attend.

Robin thanked David for his talk

ADG Jason made a few comments about the proposed visit of DG Kalma on 30th October and encouraged club members to support "ride The Train "on Oct 24th in aid of getting rid of Polio.

Clive gave out a few reminders of future activities (see notices) & closed the meeting

“Ride the Train “ to End Polio on Sat 24th October

For those of you that couldn't be at the Presidents meeting last Saturday, Mark Anderson (Rotary Foundation) spoke about the Rotary train Ride to End Polio.

This year the Train ride will also include Newcastle & Central Coast Railway stations & will start at Scone as well as at Dungog, travelling down to Gosford & then down to Berowra where Newcastle & Central Coast Rotarians could meet up with Sydney/Blue Mountains Rotarians, travel down to Hornsby with them & then return to Central Coast or continue on train to Sydney.

The idea is that Rotarians who volunteer to “Ride the Train” would get some sponsorship plus their Rotary Club would donate say \$1950 (\$10 per station) & Club Rotarians might donate/sponsor “Ride the Train” Club members @ say \$1 per station. They are also encouraging any Participants to order & wear the Red “End Polio T-shirts” which can be ordered from RDU

At the recent District Foundation meeting we asked if Central Coast Clubs be included in the Ride because they weren't last year so now that we have been included, I really hope that Central Coast Clubs will get behind this great event and support it either by donating towards it or “Riding the Train” or both & that we can get a lot of our Clubs to help end Polio by donating the \$1950 suggested.


