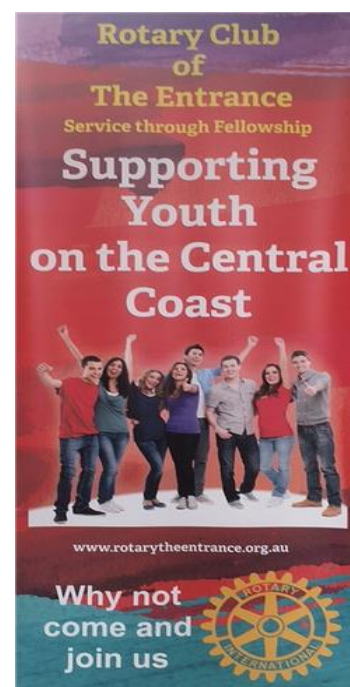

Report covering on the activities of the last 2 weeks since Issue 7

The **new Rotary campaign to assist farmers and communities impacted by the drought** has just commenced (see poster attached)

Last year we gave monies to the Rotary Clubs of Blayney & Lightning Ridge to assist their local distributions with the aim of helping the farmers but also the local shopkeepers & businesses in those towns who have also been badly effected.

To kick off this years efforts we placed donation buckets at our Bunnings Bar B Qs & our Spin & Wins . Chop butchers have also agreed to have a bucket to collect donations for our Appeal

Fundraising.

We ran Spin & wins at Bateau Bay square Shopping centre on Saturday 5th October & Saturday 19th October. Thank you to Anthony & Kathleen Trott who helped out on the first of those Saturdays. With our poster displays we received some \$30 of donations this weekend on what was quite a quiet day

We also ran a Bunnings bar BQ on Wed 16th October. David, Diane & Clive were assisted by some of the leadership Team from RYLA (Rotary Youth Leadership Award). The donations bucket yielded over \$50 towards the Drought Appeal

Community raffle- This is progressing well with Robin reporting that some 36 clubs & community organisations have taken up nearly 20,000 tickets to sell..

One organisation that has taken tickets is the Community Business Womens Network who are raising funds to support IRIS.

Sharyn Burgess asked me to promote another fundraiser for IRIS (who do great work on trying to prevent suicide). If anyone is able to go on November 9th let Clive know.

“Ride the Train “ to End Polio on Thursday 24th October

This year the Train ride will also include Newcastle & Central Coast Railway stations & will start at Scone as well as at Dungog, travelling down to Berowra. Representatives of Central Coast clubs can meet those travelling and hand over donations at Gosford Station at 2pm on Thursday.

The idea is that Rotarians who volunteer to “Ride the Train” would get some sponsorship plus their Rotary Club would donate so much per station They are also encouraging any Participants to order & wear the Red “End Polio T-shirts” which can be ordered from RDU

At the last Board Meeting the Board agreed to donate \$195 (\$1 per station from the Club) we hope that one of our members is able to meet up with them at Gosford to give them the clubs donation plus any donations that individual members might like to donate.
