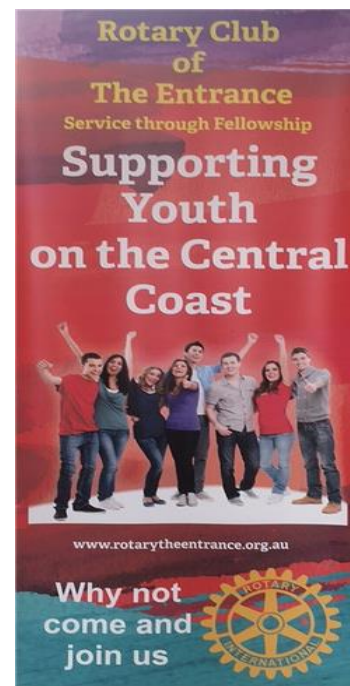

## From the New President's Desk

The first meeting of the New Year on Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> July has been set down as a Club Assembly. This gives all members of the Club , partners of family members & any friends of Rotary to opportunity to join in discussions as to the way the club is run, the Objectives we set for ourselves in the months ahead & how as a Group we intend to achieve them.

Robin, as immediate past president, and myself would like the focus of this first meeting to be on three key areas which we see as interrelated and as being critical for the club moving forward.

- 1. Membership** – Membership Director Gordon & Past President Robin were instrumental in changing the Club's Byelaws to create two new categories of membership being Corporate Membership & Family Membership & bringing them to life for the club by inducting an example of each category - TLSC Tumbi (Corporate) & the Crawfords (Family) - towards the end of last year. Both Stacey Carpenter-Salmon & Sue Kemp attended the Changeover & would be most welcome on Tuesday. Furthermore we need to give some thought to "Friends of Rotary " and how best to develop their involvement with the Club & in Shirl Llewellyn we have someone who is keen to be active in that capacity. Again we would welcome Shirl's involvement on Tuesday.  
We talked about having an information night for prospective members & friends & I'd certainly like to see discussions on firming up the concept by setting a date & discussing the various ways in which we can identify suitable potential members of all categories & how we see the program for that night ( David W has done a draft programme & Robin & I think that the 1<sup>st</sup> Tuesday in October ( where David has put down Community Service Awards) could be a goer.
- 2. Community Service & Fundraising activities- this is the essence of a Rotary club.** We need to have an interesting & challenging mixture of activities if we are to retain existing members and attract new ones.
  - Discussions re **The Community Raffle** – feedback from Robin & Clive from debrief of David W- what do we as a club need to do in July, August & September if we are to distribute tickets by planned date of 17<sup>th</sup> September
  - **Bunnings bar BBQs** – rostering for wed 31<sup>st</sup> July (5<sup>th</sup> Wed) & 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesdays from August to June. Proposal to take on 3 additional 5<sup>th</sup> Wednesdays as extras in conjunction with other community organisations. Yarran & Ronald McDonald Room has both shown an interest.
  - **New major project for the club**, depending on the size & scope we could seek to partner with another club or organisation
- 3. The Programme-** David Waterhouse, in his role as Club Service Director has produced the framework of a programme ( see separate email) for the 12 months which gives us a broad canvas for the year but it is up to us to bring it to life. Broadly speaking after July he has pencilled in 2 dinner meetings a month – the 1<sup>st</sup> Tuesday is designated for a quality outside speaker. The 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday is down as a Rotary speaker & he has suggested a roster of club members. I do not see this as meaning that that member has to be the speaker for that meeting but those nominated could also provide a friend or contact to speak on a topic of interest. It's only once a year for most of us! Both of these meetings need to be attractive not only to our members but to prospective members & visitors we wish to bring along.
- 4. Any other matters which members wish to raise**, particularly things that you'd like to see introduced, changed or improved !
