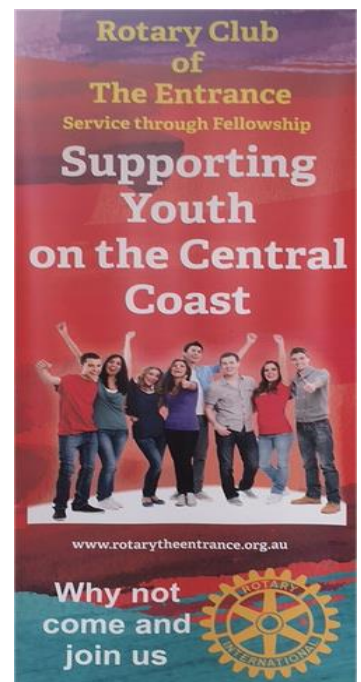

Report on Activities held over the last 2 weeks

After a four week break over the Christmas & early New Year period the club meet up for dinner at The bateau bay Hotel (who supported our first Photographic Competition last year). Ten members enjoyed catching up , having a feed and also took part in the Tuesday trivia competition.

The Bunnings Bar B Q planned for Sun 17th January was cancelled by Bunnings , who kindly gave \$500 in vouchers as a gift to help our fundraising. (Bunnings have recently said they are reviewing the current situation with Covid 19 and indicated that Bar B Qs may restart at weekends in later Feb. or March)

Fundraising-

With no other current fundraisers planned we decided to book 4 dates for selling Community Raffle before the date when ticket sales stop on February 9th . We decided to just do these in two hour slots. The first two at bateau Bay and lakeside The Entrance were not as busy as those run before Christmas but still enabled us to sell a further 144 tickets for some \$288. With the clubs licence for Spin & Win (SAW) renewed for 1st & 3rd Saturdays at Bateau Bay Square it was agreed that we would restart using the Chocolate wheel on February 20th. Joe & Clive had spoken to Joel at Chop & he had been agreeable to providing vouchers as an alternative to physical meat trays. They would have the additional attraction to customers of being able to be used for Meat or Seafood. Kathleen suggested approaching other shops in the Centre to see if they would donate vouchers for their products. This would give customers a wider range of prizes & increase the amount that the club would raise for its Project account and thence to spend on projects in the local community
