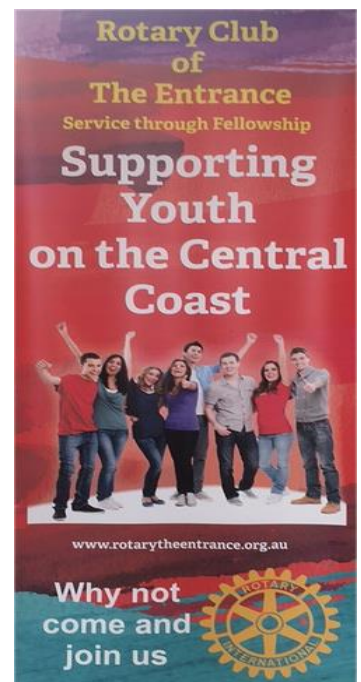

## **Report on Activities held over the last 3 weeks**

### **Meeting held at Challenge Fostercare on Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> march**

Taylor, Kirsty & Rachael hosted the meeting at their work place in the Tuggerah business park. They showed us a film about fostercaring which gave us all an insight into the challenges that foster parents are faced with and which they as case managers supporting them have to deal with . It appears to be challenging work which can bring its share of stress but also satisfaction that they are helping kids , many of whom have had very difficult starts to their lives, have a chance of a happy childhood & tradition into well adjusted adults.

Afterwards President Clive Inducted them as Corporate Members of The Rotary Club of The Entrance

**Tuesday March 9<sup>th</sup>** – Eleven Club members & partners enjoyed a social Dinner at Shelley Beach Golf Club

**Tuesday march 16<sup>th</sup>**- We had a good turnout for a meeting at Don's House. Don presented the work he had done to gather full contact details of Sponsors which included the thirty or so organisations who had donated prizes for The Photography Competition early in the year. Everyone agreed it was an important resource for the club but there were differences of opinion about how the information should be available to members. In the end it was agreed it would be stored online, protected by a password and made available to members as required eg when they were running a new project.

In order to increase the sponsors & supporters in the directory it was agreed that members should endeavour to capture all relevant contact information. Whilst it was agreed that an email address and/ or a phone number was essential a contact name & particularly, in the case of a business, a site address was also important. This information for new contacts needs to be passed on the person looking after the directory.

### **Meeting held on Zoom on Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> March**

Don introduced Michelle Dains from "Home Instead" who we had been introduced to at a Business network meeting hosted by The Rotary Club of NorthLakes Toukley.

Michelle explained that Homes Instead was focussed on providing services that enabled retirees to continue to live independently in their own homes.They act as agents for the Government scheme " My Aged Care" but also provide options of Private Care.

But to go back to basics, Michelle explained that many people as they progress into their 70's & 80's find that there is a range of activities which they find difficult to cope with and are grateful for getting help with. These can range from gardening and gutter cleaning , to areas of home maintenance inside and out. Some people require help with shopping whilst others as they get frail need assistance to shower, with

washing clothes or the more difficult areas of house cleaning. Finally, some people with memory loss require help to ensure they are taking their medicine properly.

The Federal Government maintains a Home Support Register under the banner of “My Aged Care’. There are 4 levels of support that are available. Michelle encouraged us, or any oldies that we think would benefit, to have a consultation with the councillors from Home Instead and they would assess what they require and assist in making an application . It can take from 6 to 12 months to actually be offered a package & many people start with a level one even if they are assessed as requiring more, as there is a limited availability of the higher level 3 & 4 packages. After acknowledging receipt of an application & awaiting a package, which may take up to 12 months, some people are awarded temporary codes which entitle them to certain specific services.

Michelle indicated that anyone over 65 can apply for a package. For pensioners there is often little or no cost. Self funded retirees may also apply but there is a means test & they may be required to make a contribution.

Michelle gave a short ‘promo’ for Home Instead saying that they provide a 365 days per year, 24 hour per day service, that their staff are trained & carefully referenced checked. Their motto is “ for us its personal”.

Michelle asked if there were any questions & promised to drop off booklets to Don. Don thanked Michelle for a most informative talk.

***It seems a subject which we should try to be well informed about as most of us know a range of elderly friends & neighbours and we may be able to suggest contacting an organisation like “home instead “ to see if they can get a service(s) which would make life a little easier or safer.***
