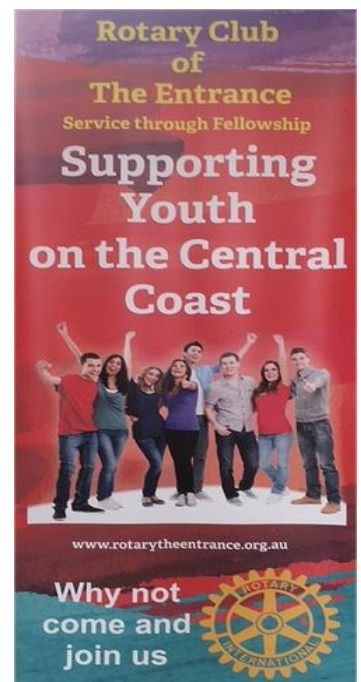

On Sat 27<sup>th</sup> March at lakeside Don introduced me to Tiffanee & her good Friend Lee. They had bought tickets & had offered to help us sell tickets. Lee offered to help at a future Bunnings Bar BQ if he was not working & Tiffanee explained how she & her Mum, Sherry had opened “Black Cockatoo & Co” in February 2020 & had only been open for 4 weeks before having to shut for 5 weeks when the Covid 19 shutdown came in to force. I agreed to go there for breakfast & include a review in this edition which follows:

**Black Cockatoo & Co** is located in The Entrance Road, opposite the side doors of the Lakeside Shopping Centre at The Entrance. It turned out to be “a diamond in the rough.” In its past life as “Gotham” in 2019 it was a rather gloomy café but ‘Mother & Daughter combo’, Sherry & Tiffanee have lightened & brightened it up with white walls and some nice paintings of beachside views. The café has four distinct areas: tables & chairs nearest the kitchen, a large table that seats up to ten in the middle, four comfy chairs around a coffee table near the window and an outside area which can be expanded in front of nearby shopfronts at weekends.

The first question which one has to answer in a review of a café is “**what was the coffee like?**” I am pleased to report that they serve a very good strong cup of coffee with a good layer of crema (they use 88 degrees by Schibello )

**On to Breakfast:** Choices included Classic & Indulgent Pancakes, Avocado Smashes & tasty wraps including a veggie one with haloumi, and a range of cooked options including a Big Breakfast which comes in Serve \$20 & half Serve \$16 & consisted of eggs, bacon, sausage, roasted (cherry) tomatoes, buttered mushrooms & baby spinach & a hash brown on a choice of thick or sourdough toast. I opted for the half serve with poached eggs on sourdough.

When it arrived on my table I was struck by how well presented it was ( see photo below ) & it tasted just as good as it looked. My half serve was plenty for me so I’m sure the full serve would satisfy the hungriest of appetites.



I’ll certainly be going again, soon, and would happily recommend **Black Cockatoo & Co** for coffee or breakfast or lunch. whilst the large table & the seats by the window offer good options for meetings
