A very personal wish.... Tuesday 7th February

On 7th February we were visited by Roger Baker, of the Mini Car Club. His personal wish was to help children who were very sick to get their own wish. Years ago he approached the Starlight Foundation with an offer to help, but they never got back to him.

His ambition did not go away. Then 2½ years ago he bought a mini and started doing it up—and joined the Central Coast Mini Car Club, which has about 20 members. Here he found a group of people who were happy to help him achieve his wish. He realised that restored cars can bring great joy to people, and that could be a way to raise money for the kids.

This time he approached the Make a Wish Foundation, who were happy to have Roger and his club on-board. It was then he spoke to our incoming President Gordon who suggested that we might be able to help him run a barbeque to raise some money for the Make a Wish Foundation—which is what we did last weekend!

Roger told us of a small boy who had participated in the program, who wanted to look for "treasure" under water.

Make a Wish organised for a detector and planted a gold watdh and other exciting

objects for him to find. He had a wonderful time and was very grateful—and died the following week.

A Very Real Exchange!

Rotary The Entrance is very excited to be the first club on the Central Coast to participate in Youth Exchange since the pandemic.

As the world continues to open up again, the Exchange Program is taking a cautious approach, and initially our District 9685 is only opening up to one country—Brazil.

Consequently, we have an unusual situation where both our Inbound and Outbound Students are exchanges with Brazil. Over the next twelve months we should learn a lot about the country—and maybe even a word or two of Portuguese!

Both Joey (Outbound) and Rafa (Inbound) made their long journeys overseas during the second half of January. Through the magic of modern communication we watched them leaving their families at their respective airports, and saw Joey arriving in Brazil a few days before Rafa arrived in Sydney. What a journey—over 24 hours and then further travel to reach their destinations.

Both boys have met up with other exchange students in their districts, having an orientation and meeting the people in charge of the exchange.

Brazil is one of the biggest countries in the world, and the biggest in South America, we have a lot of natural Variety. We have lots of beatiful citys and places to visit, like the Catarata Falls, Cristo Redentor and the beachs and nature of the North East



Presidente Prudente is a city 6 hours car drive away from São Paulo, and Its population is about 231,953. The economy is based in farms near by and companys. We also have some good colleges, like Usp and Unoeste

My House is good located and in a safe neighborhood, with lots of familys like us, is a really good environment and I love living in there. We live in a beatiful house in a condominium in the City of Presidente Prudente, and we usually go out in the weekends. My Family is composed by me, my mother, my sister, my stepfather, my father (who

lives in another city) and Kate, our Dog.

In Brazil I study biology, physics, Math, Chemystri and some others less important subjects, but in Australia I am going to study Marine Biology, Advanced Math, Standart English, Engineering, Business classes and Biology

Rafa has started school, and is hoping to be selected into the school soccer team. His first host family, Kathleen and Anthony, have taken him to Sydney exploring the sights. He will be going to the District Conference in Cowra next month, along with the other three students in the district.







From Joey:

Dear Rotary, I have now officially been in Brasil for 1 whole month. I feel like it's only been 2 weeks and times been flying by. I've done lots of new great things and experienced a lot of Brasil. Last week I went with my host father André and his tree planting group. We planted a total of 5 trees together and 40 trees all together as a group. It was good fun being out and about in the nature all morning.






