We now have the Busking Competition well advanced with seven contestants already, full sponsorship, and a good working relationship in place with Erina Rotary Club.

I am disappointed to lose the membership of Kathleen. She has been a very significant player in our club with Youth Exchange and the Bunny Hunt. The members have made it clear they would be delighted should she and Anthony chose to remain 'Friends of Rotary' and continue to participate in some of our events.



CAMP BREAKAWAY



Options Disability Support by Nicole Thorne - Operations Manager 22nd August

Nicole began by describing the benefits to those in need from the introduction of NDIS.

NDIS is a national system and people can take the funding where and when they need it in a manner not possible prior to NDIS.

Options Disability services people from 18 to 65 with the majority being in the 18-40 age range.

Options targets mental disability and gives attention to skills development in four focus areas. Independence, Creativity, Social Skills, and Community.

Five Different Services:

Edible Garden – Cultivating, growing, harvest. From this they provide food services for events, and relishes and jams. They have a café in Mount Penang Gardens, a Print Room where they can put photos onto mugs. There is also a Shed at Wyee which is on a bigger property and combines all the other activities.

There is a Theatre Company and a theatre in Tuggerah where they do drama, dance, music, art, and design – costume – backstage. Create, discover, everyday living, link and connect, be active and engaged. Social connections – group activities.

The long-term aim is to have their people leave home and be able to care for themselves.

In the following discussion it became clear there is a great potential for our club and Options to work together for mutual benefit.
