Club Roundup


Happy New Year everyone! What a busy December we had—so much going on it is almost hard to get a grip on it all.


We will try and cover most of it over the next few pages—without trying to bore you all while wee are attempting to have some well earned family time.

With a huge number of trees to be sold, we pulled out all the stops and declared All Hands on Deck! Thanks to all the Club members, family members and Rotary Supporters who turned up to help on the first day and many days thereafter we managed to sell 409 trees under quite difficult circumstances, as it played out.

Rain on the first selling

day limited the sales, as it's not so nice to take the kiddies to select a tree from under an umbrella. Nevertheless we did sell a record number that day, despite the wet conditions.

The second day dawned fine and calm, and found us back in the Mingara

carpark with a steady stream of customers. Until suddenly there weren't. Those of us there could not fathom the drop off, until we realised that the Mingara Christmas Fair which opened at 10am, had traffic at a gridlock for a good kilometre in each

direction, and no-one in their right mind would be pushing through the standstill to carry away a tree!
Regardless, we managed to sell 278 the first weekend—although had to return some to the Gosford depot unsold. And then some of our members helped







saw the bottoms off the leftover trees so they could be held over.

Feeling fresh on the following weekend, we certainly started off well on the Saturday — until it got hot! Really hot! 38 degrees hot! We stuck it out until after 1pm, selling the odd one here and there. Certainly not ideal.

The Sunday was kinder, and we managed to sell another 131 trees for the weekend. Not the overall total of 500 we had hoped—but not due to lack of effort!

Our base price for trees was \$120, but we averaged nearly \$135 using Clive's Ribbon System—where silver, gold and purple ribbons were tied to the top of the better trees, and these were sold for \$135, \$150 and \$175 respectively. We did have three totally standout trees—so we tied some red and white tape around these, which sold between \$180 and \$200.

We had great respect for those clubs who offered to sell leftover trees on the third weekend.

Well done everyone! The result for Grandparents Raising Grand-children from our club alone is \$6009—and from all the clubs on the Coast it is almost \$25,000.



Walk Against Domestic Violence





On 6th December our club were well represented at the Walk against Domestic Violence, held in Gosford, where

over 250 participants walked from the Police Station in Mann St to Kibble Park, where there was some entertainment. This was organised by the Central Coast Domestic Violence Committee. 


Don has passed over another **40 Bags of Kindness to the HoTS Team** on 9th

The number of families and children under their care programs is well down on past years although they expect it to bulid up again in 2024 . They gave us a detailed breakdown by child with age & sex & even some sug-

ren under 10 to cater for we were able to meet many of those

gestions for toys . With only 10 children under 10 to cater for we were able to meet many of those

requests. (We did warn them that with larger numbers such a specific pairing would be difficult to achieve)

Challenge Foundation

Danielle is still the team leader & she gave us a broad breakdown by age & sex. We were able to meet the toys for under 10s, some for 10 -12s and the balance of the older children by vouchers—largely Cinema (two tickets), Rebel Sport and Westfield

Bateau Bay Neighbourhood Centre With a surplus of toys for the younger age groups (particularly under 7) we were able to give BBNC a total of 35 toys. We have been supporting them with fruit & veg deliveries every Tuesday this year (principally due to donations of 6 to 15 boxes from Wamberal Fruit & Veg) and have been made aware that demand for some of their services is up by up to 500% they run a toy library as well as a Christmas gift program. Whilst they receive toys from many sources they were very appreciative of our donation.


Both Challenge and Samaritans said they would be willing to help with Rotary fundraisers in the future, in particular the Christmas Tree Sale and the Bunny Hunt.
