Three things came to the fore.





### Gosford Bulk Water Brigade Rural Fire Service 5th March, 2024

We met Graham through our Community Raffle, as they sold tickets this year. Graham came along to explain to us what the Bulk Water Brigade does.

He started by telling us that the NSW Rural Fire Brigade is the biggest volunteer organisation in the world, with

70,000 volunteers in NSW and only 940 paid workers. It takes an army of

people to keep one person on the front line!

There is more to the RFS than hoses! Amongst other specialist brigades are the Communications Brigade ("Coms"), catering brigade which can use either a mobile kitchen, or operate out

of local halls, a remote area brigade (using helicopters to gain access) and there is even a trail bike brigade based at Kariong. They have buses to move people, and a chinook helicopter to move equipment. There are even some 30 fire boats—five of which are based on the Central Coast.

But Gosford is the only brigade which is solely Bulk Water.

The aim of the Bulk Water Brigade is to be able to ensure that the guys on the front line have enough water. They drive large tankers, which have the ability to refill several smaller tankers. They are responsible for sourcing water from dams, creeks and hydrants, and even storing water in in temporary dams

made with buoy walls, sometimes big enough to refill firefighting helicopters. They keep a semi on the central coast, as well as several other tankers of various sizes. One has hoses so it can fight fires as well as topping up water. They service pretty

much all of NSW to the north of Sydney—there are other tankers kept south of Sydney, and others kept in various places throughout the state as well.

Four or five of the local members have their semi-trailer licence, and most of the rest have their heavy rigid truck licence.

Graham spoke of the *Marie Bashir* – a 737 which spreads fire retardant. It is based at Richmond but also works out of Coffs Harbour. They use volunteer drivers to deliver the fire retardant ("pink stuff") where necessary, and some regional airports have tanks as well.

We were reminded that the RFS don't only respond to fires. Other emergencies like the Lismore floods have called in many volunteers to assist—which needed not only the catering brigade but also accommodation setup for many people.

The RFS is 70% funded by insurance companies, and the remainder of the costs is shared between the state and local governments. Graham mentioned that it is not the responsibility of the rural fire service to organise hazard reduction burns.

It is the responsibility of the landholder—and in the case of government land, it is mostly the National Parks and Wildlife Ser-

Graham was a very interesting speaker, and we thank him for coming along.

## District 9685 District Conference 2024 Terrigal and Erina



First cab off the rank was the Domestic Violence walk which attracted 100 participants. We walked along the Terrigal foreshore, up the hill a bit (NOT The Skillion—that may have been too challenging for many of the walkers) and then back, gathering in the bar at the Crowne Plaza for a drink and drawing of the raffle prize. The walk was a great opportunity to talk to other participating Rotarians. I spoke to members of the Greater Sydney e-Club and Upper Northern Beaches. The \$2000 raised from entry fees will go to establishing a scholarship to help the victims of domestic violence and their children. Later in the evening the raffle held at the dinner contributed a further \$6000.



Following that was the Crowne Plaza
Beach Party which was fully booked with
320 attendees. The guest speaker, Brad
Baker, posed the question "Do you want
to be Famous?" and went on to talk
about many famous people he had met
personally, and talked about their quiet

achievements, amazing things done for their communities or others overseas, mostly unseen by the public. These other activities were the reason they had remained in his thoughts—not the original reason they were famous.

Afterwards the loss of the dance floor to additional tables was not a problem as many revellers bopped between the tables anyway once the musicians started

playing music from the Beach Boys, as well as other fun tunes from days gone by!



Saturday morning found us at the EV Church in Erina, which was a fantastic venue for a conference! The auditorium could have coped with more, and the morning tea and lunch was served in the building up the hill, which also housed the Rotary Showcase, where you could see the many projects being run in the District, and speak to people who were involved.

Jannelle Craig from RC West Pennant Hills and Cherrybrook did a great job as MC for the day. The range of speakers was impressive. We learned the difference between genomes and genetics, and how this might better define who we are; we learned how many obscure minerals go into the technology we take for granted, and how Australia might be able to benefit from being able to source these.

We heard from some of the current batch of Inbound Youth Exchange Students, as well as an update on Regionalisation. We heard about the development of a program for RYLA alumni, ensuring that they continue to develop their leadership skills.

With so many inspiring speakers it is hard to pick a standout—but for me it was Gemma Sisia and the story of the school she established in Tanzania. She had with her two graduates of her program who were impressive in both their achievements and what they are giving back.

And who couldn't be impressed with Greg Page (original yellow Wiggle) explaining how an AED machine saved his life—before making us all do Hot Potato Hot Potato!

### **Rolling to Victory**

On 5th March Julia Heckenberg attended our meeting looking for help with her project of supporting Neville Helou, a member of the Mingara Snooker and Billiards Club, who has been invited to attend the World Disability Snooker Championships to be held in Hull, UK during May. She is concerned to be able to assist Neville with his costs, in particular plane tickets to take Neville and his wheelchair to the UK, and perhaps a support person. She is in the process of organising an afternoon function at The Entrance North Surf Club, with a High Tea, Kariaoke and a silent auction. Her aim is to charge \$150 and sell 100 tickets to the event.

She is looking for a not-for profit organisation which might be able to handle the "depository" of the funds, so that the collection and distribution of the funds would be transparent. She also indicated her willingness to join the club.

### Tuesday 19th March

At our last meeting the club agreed to support Neville Helou, a wheelchair snooker player, to compete in a disabled snooker championship in Hull UK in May. New member Julia Heckenberg invited Neville to the meeting to provide some personal background.

Neville contracted polio overseas when he was quite young & lost the use of his legs. In 1993 he played in a wheelchair snooker competition at Stoke Mandeville in the UK and was placed 4<sup>th</sup>. Following that his circumstances prevented further involvement for an extended period. He has been working for Spinal Cord Wheelchair Australia co-ordinating Taxis, which provides only minimal income and thus his need for financial assistance. He took up snooker again about 18 months ago and has been playing at Mingara Snooker Club . Neville also said If snooker is reintroduced to the Olympics, the Paralympics may be considered for inclusion, for which he would be keen to represent Australia

President Gordon spoke briefly about the fundraiser planned for Sun 7<sup>th</sup> April at

North Entrance SLSC. He said after due consideration the ticket price for the main function has been reduced from \$150 to \$100 per head but also that some steps had been taken to try to reduce the cost of the trip. An approach had been made to Rotary in the UK which had resulted in an appeal on Rotary Radio UK. A request had been made to see whether a Rotarian in Hull might be prepared to host Neville for the duration of the tournament.

Julia also asked if anyone knew of a person or business that would be prepared to donate a silent auction or raffle prize for the fundraiser on April 7th


